1 Resolution XX: Acknowledging Palestinian 2 Suffering under Israeli Apartheid

3 *Abstract:* Insisting Cornell to reevaluate their response to the Palestinian resistance efforts and 4 provide more historically accurate and balanced perspectives. This resolution explains the long 5 term implications of Israeli Occupation and provides actions to be taken to better Cornell's 6 responses to current events.

11 Current Status:

12 Whereas, Last weekend, Hamas – an armed resistance front against illegal Israeli occupation 13 launched a wave of deadly attacks that marked a pivotal milestone in the ongoing Palestinian 14 resistance movement. The attacks claimed the lives of hundreds of innocent Israeli civilians and 15 even more Palestinians in its aftermath. While SJP mourns the tragic loss of lives on both sides, 16 these events did not unfold in a vacuum.

17 **Whereas,** Hamas's armed operations are a direct response to over 75 years of illegal occupation, 18 settler colonialism, ethnic cleansing, and apartheid governance endured by Palestinians. The 19 Gaza Strip has been subject to the most violent and direct forms of oppression by the Israeli state 20 and military. Gaza has been held under siege through a military blockade imposed by Israel since 21 Hamas seized control of the territory in 2007.

22 Whereas, The movement of people, goods, and aid is severely restricted creating what countless 23 human rights organizations have called "the world's largest open-air prison". Its people are 24 routinely subject to electricity cuts, military bombings of schools, hospitals, and civilian homes, 25 arbitrary raids and arrests, and unsanitary water supply that have claimed the lives of thousands 26 in the past decade. Roughly 50% of Gaza's 2.3 million inhabitants are children living in 27 conditions described by U.N. Secretary-General António Guterresas "hell on Earth." These war

28 crimes committed by Israel have been recorded by the Human Rights Watch, Amnesty International, B'tselem, and other

organizations.129

30 **Whereas,** Rather than acknowledging these root causes of violence, the increasingly far-right 31 Israeli government, with the support of the international community, has ordered a <u>"complete"</u> 32 <u>blockade</u> of the already besieged area that involves more bombing of Palestinians and the 33 complete severance of electricity, food, and fuel supplies, to a population that has no means of 34 escaping. "[When] we are fighting human animals", Israeli Defense Minister Yoav Gallant 35 recently asserted, "we act accordingly." Whilst rushing to condemn the attacks by Hamas, the 36 international community is now silently watching the Israeli government conduct one of the

largest massacres of our time against the people in

Gaza.² 37

38 Whereas, Cornell is directly complacent in the systematic dehumanization of Palestinian people 39 that sustains the status-quo. This is evidenced in the administration's refusal to acknowledge the 40 Palestinian lives lost in the aftermath of this weekend's events and in the 75-year occupation 41 leading up to it. The words "Palestine" and "Palestinians' were not once uttered in President 42 Martha Pollack's statements in response to the unfolding tragedy. The statement is not only 43 explicitly biased towards Israel but is also ahistorical and completely void of context.

44 Whereas, Cornell, like many members of the international community, rightfully expressed an 45 outpour of support for Ukrainians resisting foreign occupation by any means necessary, whilst 46 systemically failing to extend that same right of resistance to Palestinians living under settler 47 occupation.³ colonial

48 Whereas, Cornell Students for Justice in Palestine stands in solidarity with the Palestinian 49 people who are victims of the **longest ongoing military occupation in modern history**. Our 50 hearts go out to all Palestinians, who have been subjugated, displaced, harmed, and separated 51 from their families. We continue to support Palestinians' right to self-determination and 52 resistance by any means necessary - a right legally acknowledged under international law. We 53 urge members of the international community to refrain from viewing the Palestinian struggle as 54 a religious, ethnic or military conflict between two equal partners. Instead, Palestinian resistance 55 must be understood as a struggle for decolonization waged by a settler-colonial state against an 56 indigenous population. We affirm unwavering support for the Palestinian cause and the 57 Palestinian resistance efforts to liberate Palestine from Israeli occupation. By coming together 58 and taking action, we are liberating Palestine collectively. In Solidarity, Cornell Students for 59 Justice in Palestine

60 Be it therefore resolved, That Cornell reassesses its response not only to this week's events, but 61

to the events leading up to it. We desire historically and politically informed responses to this

62 ongoing violence that denounce Zionism as an ideology and acknowledge Palestinians' right to 63 existence in their homeland. We urge Cornell to recognize the Palestinian right to resistance and 64 contextualize the violence as a direct response to decades of Israel's occupation. It is Cornell's 65 responsibility to issue balanced statements that do not silence and/or erase Palestinian grievances 66 and ongoing struggle.

67 Be it finally resolved, Cornell uphold its commitment to equal protection and support and 68 adhere to its Title VI (Prohibition against exclusion from participation in, denial of benefits of, 69 and discrimination under federally assisted programs on the ground of race, color, or national 70 origin) obligations, extending those rights to every student, including those who are Palestinian,

71 Muslim, Arab, and/or those advocating for the Palestinian cause. It is vital that Cornell takes 72 measures to guarantee the safety and well-being of these minority students, in alignment with 73 Title VI.
